Visitors Nick and Brandi Boge submitted video evidence and testimony concerning nuisance smoke from Tom Clarks Outdoor Wood Furnace, Boge's asked council to deny Clark's permit request noting he had not applied for a permit before installing a new outdoor furnace as required per ordinance, Boge's stated they had reported this nuisance multiple times with no action from the city for 14yrs. Neighbors Travis and Kelly Ballou and Ginger Thomas and Boge family members Sheri and Dean Osterkamp also shared quality of life, environmental, and health concerns about Clark's outdoor wood furnace. IA DNR agent Shane Dodge also provided input, including citing Wyoming ordinance pertaining to Boge's right to quality of life, previous years reports, and complaints filed concerning Clark's furnace, Dodge stated the next step could be an air quality check cost \$3,000-\$5,000 paid for by Clark. Council member Craig Taylor reported per a request from Nick Boge, he visited Boge's house and witnessed smoke in the house and yard coming from Clark's furnace. Tom Clark stated he did not realize he needed a new permit and provided information on the new outdoor wood furnace. Clark had recently raised the chimney and requested council approve his permit submitted to the city on 11/14/23. Evidence was provided by Boge of smoke still present in his house and yard after the stack had been raised. Council directed Clark to stop using the outdoor furnace by Sunday 11/19/23. Moved by Houston second by Leonard to deny Clark's furnace permit. Aye- Huston, Leonard, Taylor, Harms. Motion carried.

Motion to approve rental inspection program by ECICOG, motion tabled until December waiting for more information and input from the public at November 29th meeting.

Motion to approve Special public meeting to discuss Current and ongoing nuisance abatements and rental inspection program, date set for November 29th at 7pm, at Memorial Hall.

Clerk discussed request for nuisance extension received today from Debra Brundage concerning property located at 105 E Main St., request was not on agenda, council unable to approve extension request, will discuss at November 29th meeting.

Clerk reported on the state of junk semi-trailers owned by Lou Somerville and located on Larry Bearce property. Bearce property to be auctioned November 24th, clerk notified auctioneer, "Bearce had received certified nuisance letter from city attorney, if sold trailers must be immediately removed or brought into compliance." If needed, the council will consider motion concerning Somerville's trailers after auction. Treasurer reported: Attending budget class, will begin budget in December. Utility billing credit limits, council and mayor recommended forwarding to city attorney for review.

Items on next agenda: 105 E Main St., Debra Brundage requesting extension for nuisance repair and payment of city property assessments.
