## Looking Back for 8-28-2025

### Midland Times: August 18, 2000 – Page 1

The city of Wyoming will undertake a smoke testing program during the week of Aug. 21. The reason for the testing is to eliminate extraneous clearwater from the sanitary sewer system.

The smoke will fill the sanitary sewer system and leak out if any illegal and inadvertent connections and piping flaws. The smoke could enter homes through dry or infrequently used traps. Although the smoke is non-toxic and non-staining, it can be an irritant if it is inhaled.

The city needs 37 manholes dug up by Aug. 23 in order for MSA to perform the smoke testing of the sewer system. A part-time laborer [Tim Watters] will be hired to assist with this job. Lifts will be installed to bring the manholes up to grade.

### Midland Times: August 29, 1975 – Page 2

#### ATTENTION : LADIES

Ladies! Here's a chance to learn something about that sport that keeps your husband so preoccupied all fall and winter-----Football!

That's right, now you can begin to determine if dad really is a football expert as he's been claiming all these years! On Tuesday evening, September 2, Midland High School Coach, Gary Stamp and his staff will host the first annual Football Ladies' Night. It will be held at the high school building and will begin at 7:30 P.M. The only men who will be present will be the coaches, so you needn't feel embarrassed in asking a "dumb question". *All the ads in this issue of the paper included a picture of a young lady giving the sign for things like offside, illegal substitution, penalty declined, etc.*

### The Anamosa Journal: August 24, 1950 – Page 5

Wyoming Historical society, organized on Sept. 4, 1924, will meet this year on Sept. 5 at the summer home of Mrs. W. E. Briggs [Elva Calkins Briggs], where the society first met.

The object of the society was to create a general interest in the study of local history, to encourage historical research and obtain its preservation. These various objectives have been foremost throughout the years.

First project was the preservation of the files of the Wyoming Journal. Society also sponsored the town's 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration.

### The Anamosa Eurika: August 17, 1950 – Page 14

#### Annual Wyoming Horse Show Slated For August 24 and 25

For the sixteenth year Wyoming will stage a Horse Show of Draft Horses with a class in Palomino's as an added attraction on August 25. As usual too, there will be classes in ponies for the children.

In addition to the Horse Show there will be a feature of interest to the women and children. This is an exhibit of flowers and flower arrangements, vegetables and fancy work, under the supervision of Mrs. Peter Sievers. This part of the celebration will be held in Memorial Hall.

### **The Wyoming Journal: August 20, 1925 – Page 1**

A ride out over the new roadbed of primary 61 east of Wyoming to the Jackson county line, Saturday evening, discloses a fine roadbed and good open corners. The work by the contractor and his crew sure was of the first class kind. The new section east of the J. W. Morse residence through the Edwards estate farm is a grand improvement: as is also the Tompkins hill. The only drawback is the unfinished section known as the horseshoe bend. This stretch of a mile or two could not be agreed upon as to location, but eventually the road will take an easterly course from the Brodersen corner through the Nolan farm, intersecting the old roadbed east of the Joe Kouba place. When completed it will be a fine road. Jackson county will continue the grading east to Maquoketa next season, connecting the graded road east from there. Soon primary 61 will take the place, to a great extent, of the Lincoln Highway and Main Street, Wyoming will be part of a cross-continent highway.

*Note: At some point Primary 61 became Hyw 64 extending from Anamosa to the Mississippi River. Highways IA 64 and IA 48 are the only two routes in Iowa where the rounded length of the route (in miles) is the same as that of the highway number.*

### **The Wyoming Journal: August 23, 1900 – Page 4**

Harry Zinn of J. R. Zinn & Sons of Oxford Mills, was in town last Monday evening conferring with the town council in relation to the franchise to be given them for an electrical light and power plant in this place. They expect to have the plant in operation at this place by the 1<sup>st</sup> of December next. They also contemplate putting a feed grinding plant here which could not fail to provide a paying investment for the owners, and also of much benefit to the cattle feeders and farmers in this vicinity.

### **The Wyoming Journal – August 1875 – Page 1**
