ISASP TESTING NEED TO KNOWS



- ISASP testing is a State of Iowa requirement for all students. They must all be taken between March 31 and April 17th.
- Please have your student in attendance on test days whenever possible. If they miss, they WILL need to make them up when returning.
- Please have your student well rested for testing.
- Please be sure your student eats breakfast the mornings of testing.
- There are practice tests available for students to take to make themselves comfortable with the format, see a teacher if interested.

- Students who are not proficient in some areas will be required by the state to participate in interventions.
- Students shouldn't stress over the tests, but should take them seriously and always give their best effort.



Third Grade Multiplication Bootcamp

Our third graders recently participated in a 10-day Multiplication Bootcamp, where they focused on mastering three multiplication facts each day. Through engaging games and creative craft activities, students explored multiple strategies to strengthen their fact fluency.

Beyond multiplication, the camp incorporated various math skills and STEAM challenges, including the one pictured. In this activity, students were tasked with designing a tent to keep their "campers" (cotton balls) dry, encouraging problem-solving, engineering, and teamwork. To wrap up the camp, students applied their fraction skills in a delicious way—by learning how

to make a s'more using fractions! This hands-on, tasty lesson reinforced key math concepts while celebrating all their hard work. Multiplication Bootcamp was a huge success!

FFA CREATED AWARD WINNING BBQ SAUCE

Things have looked and smelled a little different with the FFA



this year as a BBQ team was formed last summer - Smokeshow BBQ. With competitions at the Wyoming Fair, Rustic Days and the State Fair, students have gained a lot of experience in preparation as well as thinking on the fly when things don't go exactly as planned. The team has continued to practice their skills as they have cooked for both the staff and school board this year. Through the competitions a lot of praise was given to the homemade BBQ sauce that was initially created as a class project in Food Science and Safety. Through a lot of research the team has been able to create and market their BBQ sauce directly to consumers through Iowa Cottage Law. Our BBQ sauce has made its way across the state as each attendee of the FFA Foundation Gala took a bottle home. 
Midland FBLA Members Teach Tech
