Dear Midland Community School District,



Snow Days and Late Starts: We have had some incredible weather during the month of January! I wanted to inform everyone about the process taken before calling a late start or canceling a school day. John Stender, Transportation Director, and I begin planning and watching the weather forecasts every evening as well as tuning into webinars hosted by the National Weather Service. Mr. Stender communicates with other transportation directors in our area including, Cal-Wheat, Maquoketa, North Cedar and Monticello. Likewise, I am communicating with the superintendents of Cal-Wheat, North Cedar, Monticello and Anamosa. We are also tuning into KCRG and other television forecasts. This

gives us a bigger picture of our weather conditions and helps us make the best decision. Unless the weather is blizzard conditions, we also drive in different directions across the district to check for icy conditions and/or fog. Sometimes, this is a very difficult decision, and please know we take our school community's safety very seriously. I cannot thank John Stender enough for his hard work, diligence and going above and beyond for Midland CSD!

I am working hard to make sure and get the information out as early as possible. Here is the order that I put information out to our school community.

- 1. FaceBook I post any changes there immediately.
- 2. ParentSquare If you do not have the ParentSquare app, please email either office, and we can help you.
 - a. Cancellations and late starts are made through Urgent Alerts phone calls/texts
 - b. If the cancellation is done the night before (12-15 hours previous), I have been using the Alert System (message received immediately).
- 3. KCRG KWWL KWQC WQAD Telegraph Herald & KCCK

If you are a parent or guardian, please take note that if you have any concerns about your child(ren) driving or going to school you can keep them home, you have the right to do so. It is your responsibility to make that determination and then please email or call the school to notify them of your child(ren)'s absence.

To date we have canceled 5 school days due to hazardous conditions. We will use our Monday, April 1st, snow make-up day to remove one of them. At this time, we have 4 "Snow Days" remaining which are built into our school calendar before we will need to extend the school year past our last day of school which is, May 22, 2024. Let's hope February will be much better!



New Elementary Building ~ **Thank You, Midland!** Contractor Bids were taken on January 18th for the new elementary building project. We had several companies put in bids and they were all very close. The school board approved the bid from PEAK Construction Company, out of North Liberty on January 22, 2024. Peak has done projects for other schools in our area, and OPN Architects felt very positive about this company as they have worked with them before on other projects. Ground breaking for the new elementary building will depend on the weather conditions, but we are hoping for late spring to begin this exciting chapter in Midland Community School District's history!

ANOTHER MOHL INDUCTED INTO THE MIDLAND HALL OF FAME

Congratulations **Mark Mohl**, Athlete/Distinguished Graduate, and our latest inductee into the **Midland Hall of Fame.** Mark's father, Gary Mohl, was inducted as a member of the 2022 MHOF. Mark graduated

from Lost Nation High School in 1983.



As a student athlete Mark's basketball career was filled with achievements and accolades. Mark was awarded 1st Team All-Conference four times and was an All-Eastern Iowa Team selectee three times.

In the history of Lost Nation basketball Mark was:

- 2nd in total points scored in a single season with 689
- Scored the most points in a single game with 48
- Career Assist Leader with 368
- 4 time team MVP
- Led the state with a 32.8 points per game average as a senior.
- All-time scoring leader for Lost Nation with 1815 points.
- 2nd team All-State (back when all classes were combined)

In 2012 Mark was inducted into the IHAA Boys' Basketball HOF. Mark played at Kirkwood Community College for 1 year and led the team in scoring. He was named All-Region his freshman year. Mark then played his next 3 years for Division 2 Morningside College where he remains as one of the top 10 scorers in Morningside history and is now a member of the Morningside

Mark then moved into coaching at Osage High School where he took one team to the State Championship as an assistant and a second to the State Tournament as Head Coach. Mark recorded 440 career wins while at Osage.

In the years since leaving Osage, Mark moved into various coaching positions at North Iowa Area Community College (NIACC) in Mason City. During his 14 years as head coach at NIACC Mark posted 237 career wins. Currently Mark is the associate head coach for the NIACC Men's Basketball Program.
