#### The Impact of Open Enrollment Out and the Power of the Midland Family

Open enrollment allows Iowa families to choose a school district other than the one in which they reside. While this flexibility can benefit families seeking specific programs or opportunities, it also creates challenges for districts like Midland Community School District.

Each student who open enrolls out of Midland takes with them approximately \$8,000 in state per-pupil funding. When several students choose to attend elsewhere, the district's general fund revenue decreases, even though many expenses, such as staffing, transportation, and building maintenance, remain the same.

When that funding follows students to another district, those state education dollars, generated in part by Midland taxpayers, help support programs, staffing, and facilities in the receiving district instead of here at home. While this is how Iowa's open enrollment law is structured, it highlights just how important it is to keep and attract families who want to be part of the Midland story.

This reduction in funding can limit opportunities to expand programs, maintain small class sizes, and offer the full range of courses and extracurricular activities that help students thrive.

But the heart of Midland remains strong, and together, we can make it even stronger. As a Midland Family, every one of us plays a role in helping our district grow and succeed. We can:

- Celebrate and share our success stories. Tell others about the outstanding learning teamwork, and leadership happening every day in our schools.
- Be positive ambassadors. Speak proudly about the value of a Midland education and the caring environment we provide.
- Welcome and support new families. Our sense of belonging and community spirit are among Midland's greatest strengths.
- Stay involved and engaged. When families see our enthusiasm and commitment, they see a school worth choosing.

Together, we can continue building a school district where students, families, and staff feel connected, supported, and proud to belong. Every student counts. Every voice matters. Every link in the chain makes Midland stronger.

Our FFA **Degree Banquet** was held on Oct 28 in the Calkins Barn. Sixteen 8<sup>th</sup> graders received their Discovery Degree, which is the first step in the FFA program encouraging exploration within the organization. Fifteen 1<sup>st</sup> year members received their Greenhand Degree. Twenty 2<sup>nd</sup> year members received their Chapter Degree which is the highest degree a chapter can award to members.

Livestock Judging was at Kirkwood with Midland taking two teams. The Gold Team consisting of Quinn Hansen, Wyatt Schoenherr, Sean Christiansen, Brydenn Werden finished 4<sup>th</sup> place overall. They placed 1<sup>st</sup> in Sheep/Goat, 13<sup>th</sup> in Beef, and 15<sup>th</sup> in Swine. Wyatt finished as 3<sup>rd</sup> place individual overall and 8<sup>th</sup> in swine. Quinn placed 11<sup>th</sup> in goat category.

## **From the Nurse's Office**

#### REMINDER: We ask that you **DO NOT SEND STUDENTS TO SCHOOL SICK**.
